

SEMI-OFFICIAL CALL SETTLES ALL DOUBTS Complete Returns on the Municipal Ticket Canvassed by the Registrar's Experts.

The returns are all in. Registrar BIGEY has made a semi-official canvass and has announced the result on the city ticket. Defeated candidates are now figuring how it happened; the successful ones are receiving congratulations. With the exception of one, Justice of the Peace and three School Directors the list of successful candidates published in yesterday's Call remains unchanged. The estimates yesterday were based on returns from 229 of the 303 precincts. The fourteen precincts returned yesterday changed victory into defeat for A. J. Fritz (D.), who was believed to have succeeded G. W. F. Cook (R.). Justice Cook overcame Fritz's lead and won by 654 votes. P. A. Bergerot, Charles P. Beils and Dr. H. E. Gedge are elected School Directors in place of J. M. Thomas, William M. Cannon and A. A. Cavagnaro, who were conceded a victory by the incomplete returns.
