





# THE "IDEALISTS" AND DISCUSSION

In the discussion that has arisen in regard to what is now known as the "Milwaukee Situation," a interesting study for the class conscious Socialist. It would seem that the attempt to make clear the motive that prompts each in taking the position they do, there is no real understanding between them. **A Type Hard to Classify.**

This type is along the line of fusion in the art of being brothers.

**The Idealists' Ideal.**  
This type is mainly recruited from the professional class whose whole life experience is dominated by the life of the proletariat. Their habits, customs, dress, language and mode of thought are formed in an environment where they can not understand the proletarian psychology or the proletarian revolutionary Socialist Party from the most eminent exploiters. Their ideal is a party with no political compromise and where everybody can do anything and advocate anything in his "heart" and right whatever that may mean. They live in a cloud of abstract thought that bears little relation to the struggle for the moment. A stern revolutionary organization that must deal with stern material conditions.

for the aid that the military rendered to the hoodlums, the latter were ferocious and cruel. Nevertheless, notwithstanding the aid rendered by the soldiers the number of victims among the Jewish community was not a few streets only, and the greater part of the city was working class heroes.

"More than ordinary heroes was displayed by the members of the Self-Defense Committee. Without the aid of the military the Self-Defense movement Shomitor would have been a second Kishineff. The principal agitators came from Moscow and Tulsa and they armed not only with pistols, but with machine rifles.

**The Class was the Individual.**  
"As just here the individual was involved in the attitude of these idealists becomes apparent. They are moved by sympathy for the Jewish people and seek to shield him from the penalty the party would impose. As the whole function of the Socialist Party carrying with it the idea of permanent relief for the entire working class, is of their own consequence suffering class and its emancipation not working for his act. **THE SITUATION IN MINNESOTA**  
We have received from J. E. Nash notice to the effect that the referendum initiated by the State Executive Committee for confirmation of its act in expelling Local Minneapolis has carried the vote 47 and 35 voting "no." Neither the members of the old local or of that newly organized were allowed to vote.

**A Statement From Minneapolis.**  
Minneapolis, Aug. 24, 1905.  
Dear Comrade:—The referendum vote on the expulsion of Local Minneapolis is in and counted, the result was just what was anticipated by the members of Local Minneapolis. The vote resulted in favor of the referendum and unconstitutional action of the State Committee in expelling Local Minneapolis with 400 members. The vote was 47 for and 35 against. This vote was influenced as stated in the Toledo Socialist last week by Carl L. Thompson, National Committee member from Wisconsin, who insisted that we must have "intermediaries" to keep out "extremists." Ed. Sala, the lone member of the Finnish Branch of Local Minneapolis, who has lined up with the "compromisers" was employed for three weeks by the State Executive Committee and called upon the Finnish comrades on the Iron Range and in Duluth. In addition to this the Toledo Socialist last week published an account which would also have a tendency to influence the vote.

Correspondence

State Secretary Graham reports the receipts from dues, supplies and donations for the first two weeks in August as follows: \$70.85.

J. H. Walsh organized a local at Helena and (Chicago) Burgess reorganized and (Chicago) Lewiston and organized a local at East Helena.
